With this thought in mind, we the N.F.A. boys, have concentrated our efforts upon compiling a story book of pictures and dates that we feel are worth remembering.

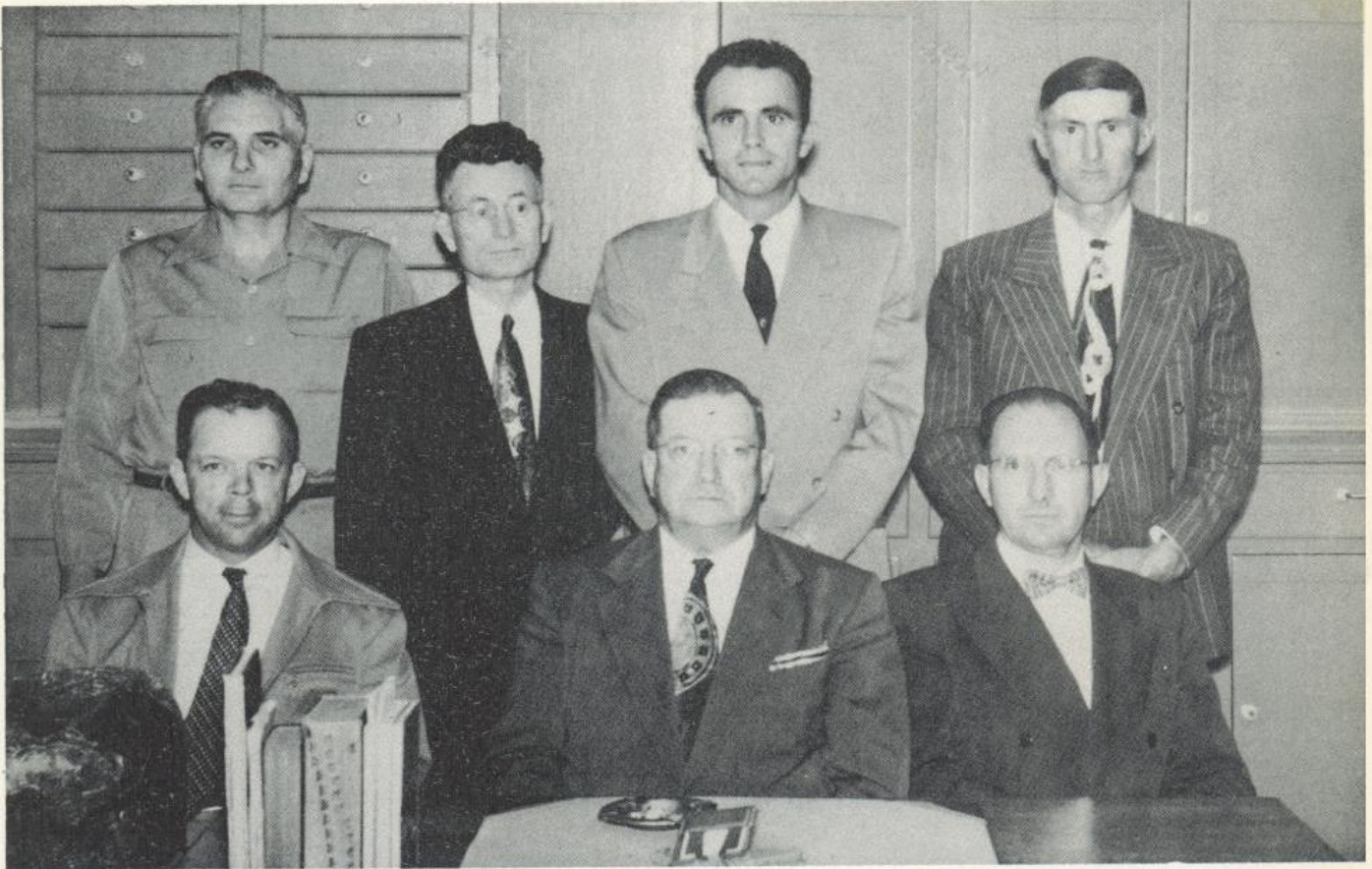
In years to come, while you are thumbing through this book, we hope it will take you back to this year where once more you will think of us.
